

We have a well-established Eco Committee that works hard to generate and implement new ideas to reduce our carbon footprint and enhance biodiversity. Our focus is on long-term environmental initiatives, recognising their importance in shaping lasting habits and mindsets. We are especially proud that our pupils have a strong voice: they not only share their ideas but also take action and lead assemblies. You can find out more on our Young Leaders Padlet page.

We have optimised our heating system to improve energy efficiency and introduced timed charging systems for devices to reduce overall energy use.

Compost bins are used to recycle organic waste and support the healthy growth of our plants.

Our extensive school grounds include a copse of trees, along with bird boxes and bug hotels to support local wildlife. We have also successfully secured free trees from the Woodland Trust, which are due to be delivered in November 2027.

We are currently working towards the Learning Outside the Classroom Award, further enriching our pupils' experiences.

In addition, we are part of the Let's Go Zero Schools initiative, where our Eco Team continues to develop and lead environmental projects.

We are committed to recycling as much as possible, including food waste, textiles, pens, batteries, electronic waste, plastics, and paper/cardboard.

Our fantastic PTA supports sustainability by organising second-hand uniform events and coordinating the reuse of unclaimed lost property.

Environmental impact is a key consideration when purchasing equipment or selecting suppliers. For example, our cleaning company uses environmentally friendly products, and our caterers avoid single-use plastics.

We also engage with Green Ambassadors on climate issues whenever possible—see our Action on Climate Change page for more information.

We are proud to have a dedicated Eco & Sustainability Link Governor who reports to the Resources Committee and sits on the Full Governing Body, ensuring sustainability remains a priority across the school.
