Thank you very much for taking the time to write to me about improving recycling facilities in our local area. It is great to hear how passionate you are about this issue and about protecting our local environment and the health of the planet. I can really see the pride you have in your area.

I completely agree with you that littering is an important problem and stops people from feeling proud about their local area. You are right that recycling is everyone's duty, and we should all work together to keep our streets and town centres clean. I found your argument very persuasive that we should improve recycling facilities making it easier for everyone to recycle, and increase people's knowledge about what can be recycled, so that everyone can play their part and dispose of their waste responsibly.

Thank you also for highlighting the amount of food waste that schools produce, I would be more than happy to work with your teachers and the local council to try and see this amount of waste decrease. I agree that it is essential that children and young people learn how important it is not to waste food, and how crucial recycling is to protect our planet, as well as the local environment.

As a result of your letters, I have written to Nuneaton and Bedworth Borough Council asking them to review what action can be taken to improve littering and recycling. I have asked for signs to make it clear where people can recycle, and to encourage residents not to litter.

I will keep an eye out for opportunities to raise your concerns in Parliament and with ministers. Thank you again for writing to me.
