## R.E.

We will investigate what difference it makes to believe in Ahimsa, Grace and Ummah. We will make links between the three concepts and weigh up the values and impacts of these.

#### **P.E.**

We will engage in competitive team sports, focussing on invasion games such as tag-rubgy. We will also be developing our levels of fitness and stamina by engaging in cross country running.

# P.S.H.E.

We will be looking at celebrating our differences. We will discuss how people can have power over others. We will discuss the perception of 'normal' and look at how conflict and be resolved.

# <u>Humanities.</u>
