## Assembly focus

We had two representatives from the Bedworth Lions join us last week for our assembly. They have visited many schools in Bedworth to launch their 'Tommy' project. (Please see attached leaflet.) The children were very motivated to enter the competition and will be writing poems, stories, letters or painting pictures to support the project. If they want to do extra at home then send their finished articles into school and we will make sure that their entries are sent to Bedworth Lions.

## Woodwind lessons

The children recently had the opportunity to listen to a musician playing a woodwind instrument. Warwickshire Music have offered the school music lessons from the musician - these will need to be paid for by parents at the usual tuition costs of £25 per half term. This should build on the children's understanding of playing the recorder. Please contact the school office if you wish your child to access this tuition.

#### Essential work to gas pipes on Wheelwright Lane and Burbages Lane

We have been informed that essential work to the gas pipes outside the school along Wheelwright Lane and all the way down Burbages Lane will be carried out over the next few weeks. The work was due to start on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> November and last up to Christmas. The footpath along the right hand side of Burbages Lane (from the top near the school to the bottom) will be closed in sections and pedestrians will be advised to use the opposite side. Please be aware that parking will be very limited as there will be extra lorries and vans parked in the lane. There may be temporary traffic lights and I will let you know as soon as I have this information. Please allow yourselves extra time in the morning to park and bring the children in to school. I will keep you updated with the progress.

## Family Support Hubs

Across Warwickshire, in Nuneaton, Bedworth, North Warwickshire, Rugby, Warwick and Stratford, Family Support Workers are available to listen to families and professionals and support with issues that families may be facing. The Family Support Hub at St Michaels Centre, Bedworth is open daily for families to drop-in for advice and support. (Further information to follow)

The Family Support Workers can offer telephone support with issues around:

- child behaviour
- routines and boundaries
- sleep
- toileting
- eating and related issues
- social and emotional development
- parental isolation
- parental conflict
- any other support for parenting

They may be able to help you over the phone there and then, they may signpost you to a drop-in session for a face to face conversation, they may signpost you to the Family Information Service or they may signpost you book on to a parenting course or workshop.

The full size statue commemorates the fallen of WW1 and is yet another reminder of the fact that the town has continually observed Armistice Day every year since 1921.

The Tommy is being taken around schools, places of worship and community centres in Bedworth, Bulkington, Exhall and surrounding villages.

Denise Musson who joined us and is project lead for Bedworth Lions said: "We will be holding drawing, poetry writing and story writing competitions at each venue, based on the Tommy and his possible life before and during the war.

"Bedworth Lions will donate small prizes.

"However, it is planned that we will in the future, produce a book called 'The Bedworth Tommies', using all the best competition entries.
