# Visitors to Year 2

Year 2 children have had many visitors over the last two weeks. Dr Ahmed came in to talk about



her role as a G.P. She talked to the children about the importance of personal hygiene and how to avoid nasty bugs and microbes. She also spent time telling the children how to stay safe and not to eat things they find lying around that may look like sweets - as they may be prescribed tablets.



Mrs Lapsley came to teach the children about Florence Nightingale and her role in the Crimean War - Mrs Lapsley is a bit of an expert on this. The children were in role as nurses and injured soldiers for the day - a great experience for all the children and staff.



Mr Gannon came in to talk about his experiences as a soldier and the importance of being organised. He explained to the children

the importance of keeping your kit and belongings clean and tidy and to keep yourself clean and tidy too.



Mr Pook also came in to talk to the children about his experiences as a soldier. He brought along medals and photographs and talked to the children about organisation and teamwork.

## Essential work to gas pipes on Wheelwright Lane and Burbages Lane

We have been informed that essential work to the gas pipes outside the school along Wheelwright Lane and all the way down Burbages Lane will be carried out over the next few weeks. The work was due to start on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> November and last up to Christmas. The footpath along the right hand side of Burbages Lane (from the top near the school to the bottom) will be closed in sections and pedestrians will be advised to use the opposite side. Please be aware that parking will be very limited as there will be extra lorries and vans parked in the lane. There may be temporary traffic lights and I will let you know as soon as I have this information. Please allow yourselves extra time in the morning to park and bring the children in to school.
