#### Science week

Children learnt a lot about some of our great scientists during science week.

Year 2 children learnt about Mary Anning (an English fossil collector and palaeontologist who became known around the world for finds she made in Jurassic marine fossil beds in the Dorset cliffs). They enjoyed rock collecting in the school grounds.



Year 5 and 6 learnt about science pioneers: Edward Jenner (pioneered the concept of vaccines), Jocelyn Bell Burnell (astrophysicist), Ada Lovelace (mathematician), producing fact files for our school display. The children were amazed at the diverse fields of study in Science.

They learn that curiosity is the key - it is important to ask questions and notice the world around them. We have encouraged them to keep asking the question, 'Why?' I hope this hasn't put too much pressure on you at home.
