# Attendance

It is expected that all children will attend school every day unless they are unwell. We aim for at least 96% attendance as a school and will be reporting our attendance figures to you each week. The school doors open every day at 8:45am to enable children to be ready to learn by 8:55am. It is important that children arrive on time so that they can greet their friends, organize their belongings and hear important information which will support them with their learning. Children arriving after 9am will automatically be marked late on the school register.



During our staff inset day on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> September all of our school staff received statutory safeguarding training and updates. The safeguarding and wellbeing of our pupils is paramount and our staff are committed to maintain a culture of vigilance across our school community. # **Physical Activity**

Over these next few weeks we will be accessing our outdoor areas more frequently than normal. We will be providing daily exercise for all children. Your child will need to have their P.E. kit in school and left here for the half term.

KS2 children will need trainers so they can access the field (sometimes it is a little muddy).

KS1 children will need their trainers or their wellingtons.

Reception children will need their wellingtons in every day.

Please note that children must wear non marking pumps to preserve our newly surfaced school hall floor.

#### Inhalers and medical arrangements

Please make sure that your child has an inhaler in school if needed. Some of these were sent home in June/July for home use. Also please inform the office for any other medical updates.

#### Universal free school meals

A reminder that the Government are still funding free school meals for children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. We would encourage you to take advantage of this as this is a good saving for the family and ensures that your child has a healthy balanced meal every day.

For the rest of the school, dinners are priced at £2.30 per meal and our preferred method of payment is through PAY360 (information on website).

### Staff Training

During our school inset days on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> September our staff have received additional training by our school Educational Psychologist around The Zones of Regulation. As part of our school Relationships Policy we continue to support children with emotional regulation. The Zones of Regulation is a highly visual resource in each of our classrooms that help support children with labelling and discussing their emotions. As children grow and develop they learn new strategies that help them to cope with big emotions. The children may well come home this week and tell you all about which colour zones they have been in today! We will be hosting information sessions for our parents over the coming months so look out for it in our news letters.

#### Nursery Places

Our Nursery is very popular and places fill up very quickly – usually a year in advance of the children starting. Please be aware if you have young children at home and would like a nursery place you will need to book them in a year before they are due to start. Please contact Miss Gibbs (Nursery Manager) who will be able to help you.

#### Cool Milk

Free milk is available for all children aged under five in school, funded by the UK government.

In our school, this milk is provided by Cool Milk, the UK's leading school milk supplier.

When your child turns five, you are able to pay a subsidised rate for your child to continue to receive milk. If you wish for your child to continue receiving milk from the age of five, simply register with Cool Milk directly via their website (<u>www.coolmilk.com</u>). They will then contact you at the appropriate time to arrange pre-payment.
