Our whole school attendance this half term was 95.14%

Authorised absences this half term came to a total of 410.

Unauthorised absences this half term came to a total of 201.

Our combined absence this half term came to a total of 611.

Lateness

It is really important that pupils arrive to school on time. The school doors open at 8.45am to ensure children have time to say good morning to their friends and teachers and put their belongings away. This is a positive and cheerful way to start the day and be ready to learn. When children arrive in class they will have the opportunity to read their books or complete a focused learning task. This is a great way to get children's brains warmed up and ready for their lessons which will start promptly at 9am.







Children that are late to their lessons will miss out on all of these valuable experiences which can leave children feeling rushed, flustered and having to catch up on what everyone else is doing. Research tells us that this puts our brains into a high alert state which can impact on our ability to learn effectively. Being on time is so important for our children.





The number of lateness this half term was 82



5 minutes late every day for a year is the same as 3 days absent!
