Uniform reminder.

Just a gentle reminder that the children must wear full school uniform each day. This consists of a white polo shirt, blue WWL jumper, black or grey trousers and knee length skirts. We would also encourage tights to be worn under skirts as the weather is starting to turn much cooler. Stud earrings may be work but we discourage other forms of jewellery as they get easily damaged or lost in school and this causes significant upset to children and parents. Please also note that make up, nail varnish and nail acrylics are also not part of the Wheelwright Lane School Uniform Policy.

School Uniform is an important part of school life. It brings our children together as one 'family' and ensures that children have a sense of belonging to our school and its values. When the children enter school, they bring a sense of pride in the uniform they wear and, in our learning, behaviours. It is also good preparation for secondary school and for future work where uniform and dress code will be a compulsory aspect.
