#### Staff Inset Day

Oure staff training on Tuesday 3rd January was a busy event. Our senior leaders in school led a series of workshops and training for our staff. Mr Trew our Upper Phase Leader and English standards leader has delivered training around our new Spelling Shed program. Your child will receive a log in to use at home to support with their spellings. Mrs Haughey and Mrs Hammonds, our Lower Phase Leaders and Maths Standards leaders led training around the use of manipulatives in mathematics - use of concrete resources is a vital part of mathematical fluency, reasoning and problem solving. As part of our school relationship motto Be Kind Be Safe Be Fair I delivered training around restorative practice. This is at the core of our Relationship Policy and focuses on adults supporting children to reflect on their actions and choices. We look forward to incorportaing this as part of our Zones of Regulation work which we introduced last year.

#### Parent Workshops

We will be continuing our parent partnership work this half term. Last term we delivered workshops around reading and mathematics and this term we will inviting parents in for our SEND coffee morning, year 2 SATS meeting and Zones of Regulation workshops. Please keep a look out for these in our weekly newsletters. We will also be sending out a parent questionnaire which helps to guide our work with families.





#### **Attendance and lateness**

As a school we are committed to ensuring that every child has access to a broad and balanced curriculum. We know that every minute spent in school is an opportunity to learn and we want all of our children to thrive. Please ensure that your child is on time for school every day. The doors open at 8:45am and lessons start at 8:55am. Similarly, we aim for at least 96% attendance for all of our pupils. We know that illness cannot be helped, especially during the autumn and winter months. However, please do not be offended when we call or write to you to ask about your child's attendance. This is part of our duty around attendance and safeguarding.



#### **Home Learning**

Please remember that home learning is an important part of consolidating key skills and knowledge taught at school that week. The school have paid into online resources such as Times Table Rockstars and Spelling Shed to support with learning at home. If you have any problems accessing these please contact your child's teacher so that they can help.



Daily reading in vital in all year groups. Children develop decoding and fluency skills as well as develop their understanding of new words. Evidence shows that fluent and competent readers are more likely to become better writers. Reading is also the gateway to the curriculum and

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the wider world. Please ensure you read with your child regularly. We recommend 3 times per week. Even older children benefit from being heard read. If your child is in key stage 2 they are set reading questions each week. It is important that this is completed to ensure they are prepared for the lesson
