
# Wheelwright Lane News

#### A special message





The staff and children at Wheelwright Lane would like to send a very special message to one of our pupils who is currently at home recovering from major spinal surgery. Daisy, one of our reception pupils, has recently undergone her 9<sup>th</sup> major operation. At just 4 years old Daisy has spent a significant proportion of her life in hospital having been born without a hip. Incredibly a new hip was made for Daisy, but she has continued to undergo many surgical procedures. Daisy is such an inspiration to us all. She never lets anything get in her way and demonstrates incredible resilience and determination. In assembly on Monday I shared Daisy's story with the children as we talked about overcoming challenges and achieving our goals and dreams. Daisy is fiercly independent - a skill that Daisy's parents and siblings have encouraged from a young age. We send Daisy our very best wishes and we will keep you updated on her progress.

#### High temperatures in children



You will be aware from recent news bulletins and from my letter last week that there are many viruses circulating at present. We are advised that parents should keep their child at home if they have a termperature. Please telephone the school to let us know if your child is at home with a temperature and monitor them. If you are unsure of their symptoms please do telephone 111 or call your GP. Please ensure your child returns to school as soon as they are well.

Mrs Wall, who is our local authority moderator for year 2, and Miss Wass will be hosting this workshop. This will be an opportunity for parents to ask questions and look at some examples of SATS test papers. Mrs Wall and Miss Wass will also talk you through the process and how we support the children during their SATS, which usually take place in May. We ask that you do not request holiday or take your child out of school between now and the end of May as this is an important time for the children. We keep the SATS tests very low key and fun for the children and want to reassure all our parents of this.



#### Year 3 Swimming



The children were incredibly excited about their first swimming session last Friday. I was so pleased to hear that the children demonstrated their learning behaviours, being brave, determined and resilient! Every Friday of this half term the children in year 3 will attend their swimming lessons with Mrs Cullinane who is one of our teachers and also a trained swimming teacher. We are so lucky to have a member of our staff that is also able to teach swimming and water safety. We are also delighted to be back using the Exhall Grange swimming pool for our lessons. This is something that we always did prior to the pandemic. The children make the very short 5 minute journey across our school field over to Exhall Grange with our staff. We are so fortunate to have such close links. Year 4 will start their swimming lessons after the half term break. By the end of primary school all children should be able to swim 25 meters. We do recommend that your child has additional swimming lessons outside of school to ensure they achieve this crucial life skill.

#### **SEND** coffee morning



This half term we will be introducing our first coffee morning for parents with children who have special educational needs and disabilities. The coffee morning will be run by Mrs Ford who is our school SENDco. The coffee morning will be an opportunity for parents to find out information about how they can support their child and signposting to services. Over time we hope that our coffee morning will give parents an opportunity to share their experiences and offer support to one another. We encourage parents to attend this supportive forum. Initially these workshops will be run during the school day on Mondays. Our first one will take place on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> January at 9:15am until 10:15 am. For our first meeting a representative from the Family Information Service and one of our colleagues from STS (Specialist Teacher Service). This will be a good opportunity to ask questions and find out about the support available.

#### **Year 2 SATS workshop**



We will be warmly inviting our year 2 parents to attend one of our two sessions about the statutory SATS tests for year two pupils. This will be held on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> January at 3:20pm and again at 5:30pm. We recommend all parents of a child in year 2 attend one of these sessions.

As part of our work with parents our maths and English standards leaders Mr Trew, Mrs Haughey and Mrs Hammonds will be sending out a half termly newsletter specifically related to maths and English. Each letter will contain information to help you support your child at home and sign post you to helpful websites, apps and give you top tips.
